Hazard Highlight: Safe Driving Practices

For most of us, driving is a part of daily life. Even if we don't drive or operate construction equipment on the job site, most of us commute drive to and from work and other personal use.

On the jobsite...it is very important to be aware of your surroundings. Many of our job sites are in and round existing facilities that can be damaged by construction equipment. Always obey posted speed limits and follow all traffic signage. Because traffic patterns can change on the jobsite, always make sure and double check during your JSA to verify traffic routes and remember to follow the signals of flaggers and spotters.

In personal vehicles...your chances of being involved in an accident are 1 in 366 for every 1,000 miles you drive. There are several safe driving technics that we should all use daily to lessen our risk of incident.

1. Don't drive under the influence or while overly tired. Driving under the influence of drugs and alcohol can lead to jail time, loss of license and the monetary cost of a DUI conviction is extremely high. Driving while overly tired often mimics the hazards associated with driving under the influence
2. Obey speed limits and other signage. Be sure and leave for your destination with a little extra time to get there.
3. Don't drive distracted. Distractions come in many forms; mobile devices, eating, drinking, children or other passengers and controls in the vehicle such as temperature and radio.
4. Maintain a safe distance between you and the vehicle in front of you and look ahead in traffic. are going to do.

Remember that this is the time of year when children are going back to school, traffic patterns are changing, there are more children on the road waiting for buses and riding bikes to school. Be extra cautious for these hazards, especially during dawn and dusk hours.


From our leaders...


