## Hazard Highlight: Situational Awareness & Mindfulness



Situational awareness is intentionally being aware of your surroundings and being mindful of the risks and changing conditions around you. This is important at work and at home, especially during the holidays.


### At work...

Know your surroundings and take the time to reassess work areas for changes; especially after breaks, leaving and returning to an area or other pauses in work. Always look above, below and around before entering any construction area. Hazards can be found in areas we don't expect them. Also, make mental notes of existing structures, buildings and fences when doing your work. When necessary create visual notifications of their locations by using flags, paint, etc.

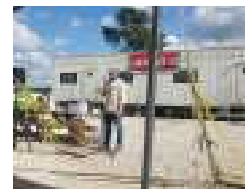
